

Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund
State-by-State Breakdown

The Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (\$54.3 billion) will be distributed to states based on their relative shares of grants awarded under [Title I-A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act](#). This analysis does not include funding from the Emergency Education Relief Grants to Governors Fund or from any other fund within the relief package.

To produce these estimates, LPI staff used data from the [Congressional Research Service dated August, 2020](#). These estimates of state-by-state allocations used the most recently available enrollment data from the [National Center for Educational Statistics](#) (Fall 2016) to determine the per pupil funding amounts. At least 90% of the money from this fund must be distributed by states to districts based on their Title I-A payments.
